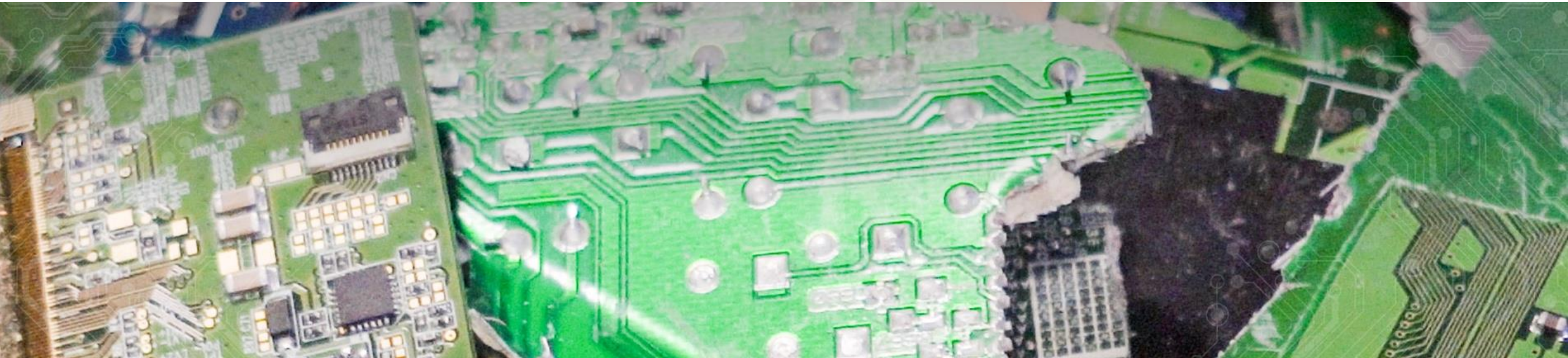

- A national industry-led, not-for-profit representing 7,000+ stewards across Canada
 - Operate regulated end-of-life electronic recycling programs in 9 of 10 provinces
 - Collection network of 3,100+ sites nationally, 80+ in Nova Scotia including 12 municipal
 - 1.3M tonnes collected and responsibly recycled...and growing
- Only approved and regulated electronics recycling program in NS, since 2007

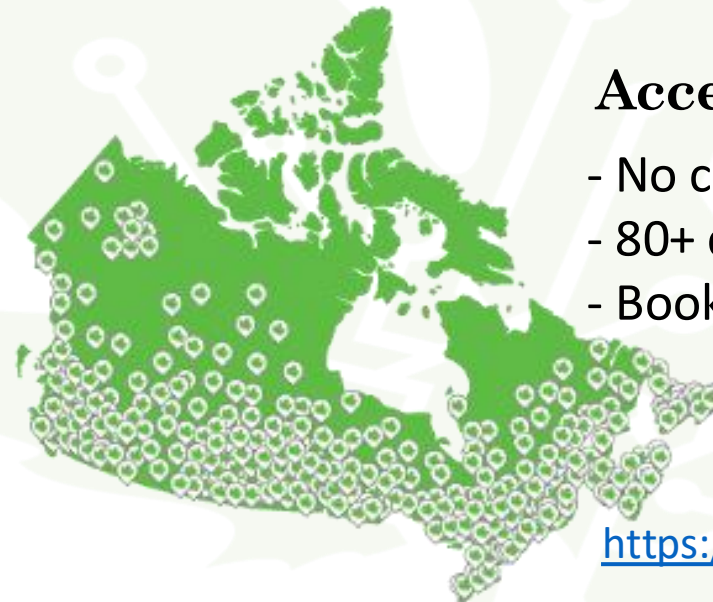
